PASTOR'S CORNER

A Cultivated Heart-The Panacea For Divine Peace
(Prov. 3:1, 2. Mark 4:3-8; 39)

God has planned from the beginning to do all his work on earth through men (Gen 1:26; Ps 115:16). However, the scarcity of the power of God in any generation is not the deficiency of God in that generation. It is rather the unavailability of men whose hearts are uncultivated for His purpose. Until God finds a man whose heart is cultivated, He will not release the rain, which is 'God's divine Peace and blessings'. Instead of crying for rain (peace, prosperity), each man's heart should be consecrated to handle divine visitation.

In Gen 2:4-7 while there was no man to till the ground, God held the rain. It was after God formed the man that He began to release rain. While man was not yet formed, God arranged for a mist to arise from the earth to water the ground (a make-shift arrangement).

Many congregations today are only enjoying mist rather than rain as a form of godliness. God is judicious with heavenly resources, but when there are no hands to handle his resources, they will be wasted. What attracts God to a man is a cultivated heart that is sincere and broken. God does not look for men with a form of godliness.

What is your heart condition? Is your heart correct?

Today's topic surveys the vital role a man's heart condition plays in how much impact God's Word has in making him fit for God's service by considering the Parable of the Sower in Mark 4:1-10.

Yield your heart unto him & he will process it in the most profitable way.
